The Food Pantry gave Chuck the boost he needed to get through that rough patch. And, he was grateful for the support, but, being Chuck, he couldn't help noticing ways he could help out—cleaning, sorting, organizing the garage, etc.

So, he offered to volunteer—and he never stopped.

In addition to improving every facet of food allocation and storage, Chuck brought his sunny attitude and sense of humor to serving clients directly. And, when the lockdowns came in 2020, this seasoned veteran wasn't fazed in the slightest. More concerned with the needs of others than his own health and safety, Chuck didn't miss a single day of work during the pandemic. In fact, Chuck only wanted more. So, he began volunteering at our main building—helping with maintenance, lawn care, and other groundskeeping.

When asked how he managed such an unyielding workload during his years of military service, Chuck credited his parents for instilling discipline and a strong work ethic in him at an early age. The staff at the Food Pantry aren't sure how they ever functioned without him. Their descriptions of Chuck couldn't be more glowing: "Hard-working, loyal, forward-thinking, dependable—you can count on him, no matter what. He always gives 110%, and then some. He's everyone's right-hand man." And, on top of all that—he makes everyone laugh.

As for Chuck, he doesn't know what all the fuss is about. He just stays focused on whatever it is that needs to be done. In his mind, life is pretty straightforward: "It's all about treating people the way you want to be treated."

Spotting Chuck at work might not be easy—he's always in motion. But, if you volunteer at our Northside Food Pantry, you'll probably see him long enough to give him a salute. We don't know anyone who deserves it more.

HELPING SENIORS AGE AT HOME

Angels Among us

With an ever-growing population of seniors in our community, CSSW has been facing an avalanche of requests for our Home Maintenance and Safety Services—a program that provides simple home repairs and safety installations for seniors who want to maintain their independence. In December of last year, our maintenance technicians were doing the best they could with a 2006 Ford F-150 that was requiring increasing and extensive repairs—over \$8,000 in the past five years. Our crew knew it was only a matter of time before a more reliable vehicle would be needed.

CSSW's commitment to providing home services to our senior clients simply could not be fulfilled without a reliable mode of transportation. So, as Christmas approached last year, we made a personal appeal to a certain someone with a history of community support.

We took a chance that our need to serve seniors at home was compelling – a new truck, along with a hitch, snow plow, ladder rack, and toolbox. The estimated cost? \$40,000. Our need was urgent, but we were uncertain of the response we would receive. After all, everyone is busy in December, and we were asking for quite a big gift. But, then again, isn't Christmas all about miracles?

Just two days after we sent the request, this thoughtful benefactor—a widowed, nonagenarian, to be precise—sent us exactly what we asked for! Was it a miracle? We'll leave that question to the theologians. But, for us, it may as well have been. Acutely aware of the vulnerability of seniors, this heroic donor knew she was fortunate to have the resources to live on her own. But, like any superhero, she wasn't going to just sit back and relax while others were in trouble.

You may be thinking our hero has been supporting CSSW for decades, so this gift wasn't so unusual. But it was unusual. This was her very first gift — one that will make a difference in the lives of so many seniors.



But, she wasn't the only one who helped. Our long-time supporter, Gene Butman Ford in Ypsilanti, stepped in to finish the job. And, in May we drove off with a new F-250 Ford truck!

Started by Gene Butman in 1957, this family-owned business has been headed by Gene's son, Ken Butman since 1980. The Butman family has partnered generously with us, both as donors and leadership volunteers.

As Tom Butman, General Manager at Gene Butman Ford, explains, "Our family and business have been fixtures in the Ypsilanti community for decades. We care about our neighbors and appreciate the opportunity to

give back to help others."

Our donors turn lives around. This new truck allows our technicians to safely provide routine household repairs, safety device installations, lawn mowing, and other tasks for seniors in need. Keeping seniors in their homes for as long as possible plays a critical role in maintaining their mental and emotional stability. For the community, these measures also ease pressure on the nearly saturated market

for senior housing. Our Home Maintenance and Safety Services program accepts fees, but no senior is denied help if they can't pay. Simply put, the impact of this new truck is immeasurable.

"We are so grateful the donor whose thoughtful generosity made it possible for CSSW to acquire this new vehicle," says Kasey Kerr, Director of Senior Services. "And, with the Butmans' additional support, we'll be able to take care of some very basic needs of older adults in the community."
